





Meanwhile, marketplace demand steadily increases.





A blended solution of technologies is emerging to fill the gap: Stenography, Voice Writing, Digital Reporting, Video Reporting, this while the industry seeks help from technology to maximize and supplement its workforce.

Could artificial intelligence be part of the future? Undoubtedly, but the demand for accuracy within a legal environment means the human element can never be replaced.

By 2028, 18,477 positions that now or in the recent past were filled by stenographers will be held by professionals employing something other than stenography to capture the record and convert it to text.

And the stenography shortage will continue to grow.
